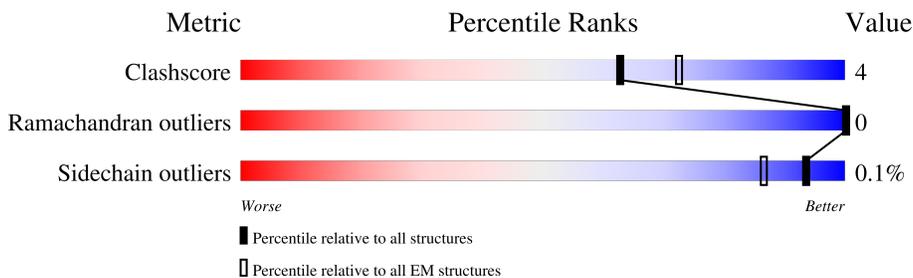
1 Overall quality at a glance i

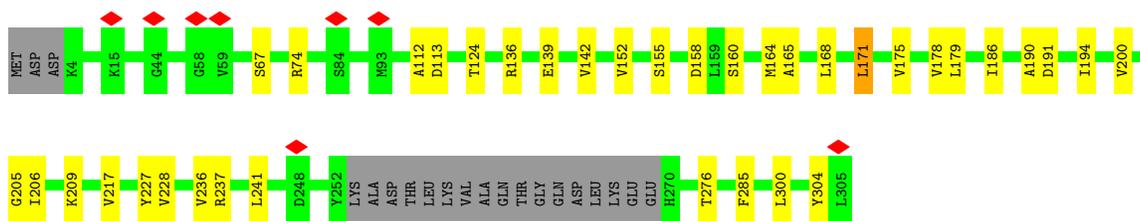
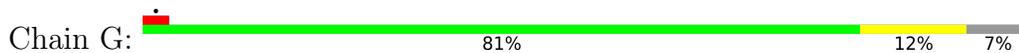


• Molecule 2: Translation initiation factor eIF-2B subunit beta

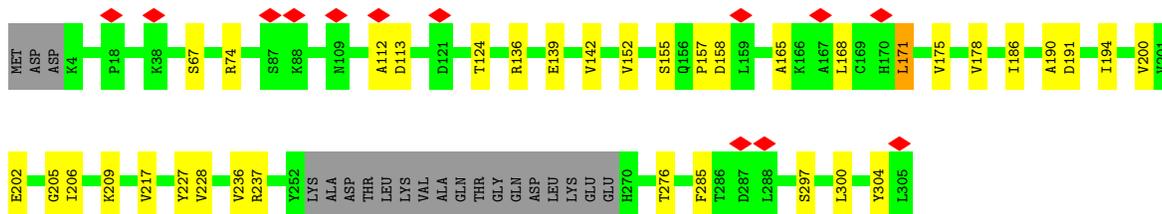
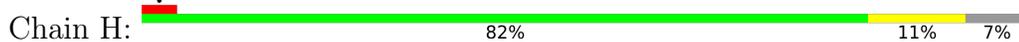


• Molecule 2: Translation initiation factor eIF-2B subunit beta

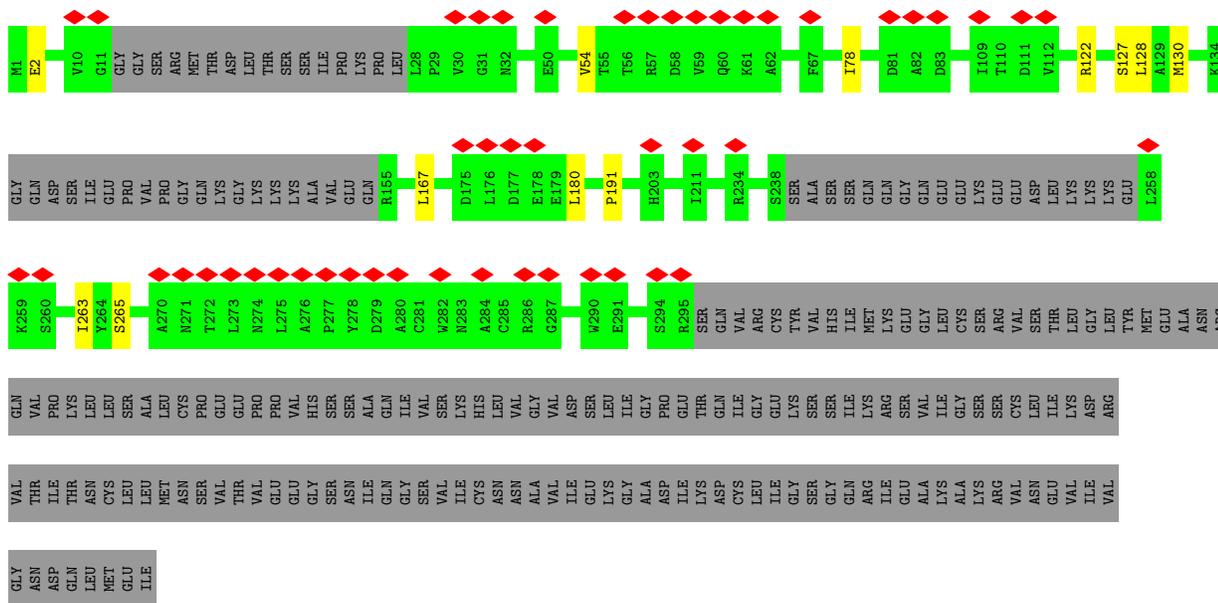




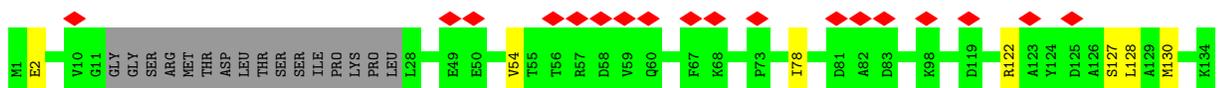
• Molecule 4: Translation initiation factor eIF-2B subunit alpha

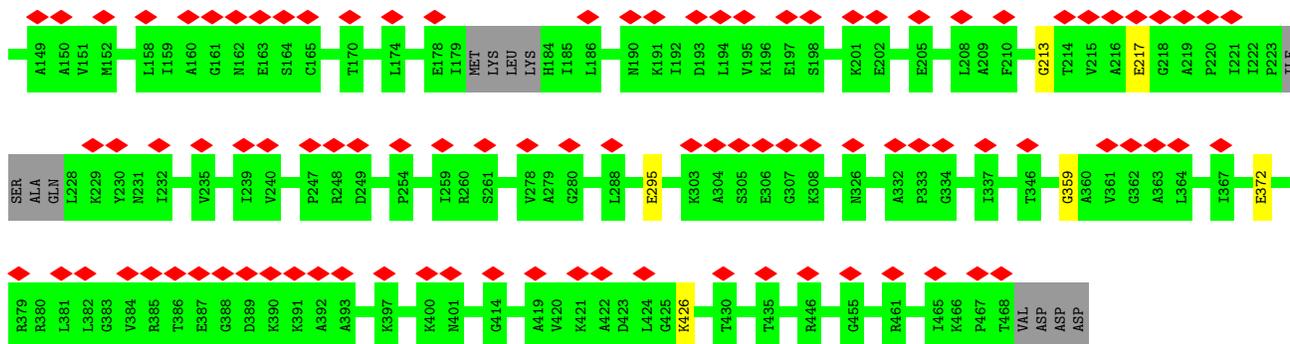


• Molecule 5: Translation initiation factor eIF-2B subunit gamma

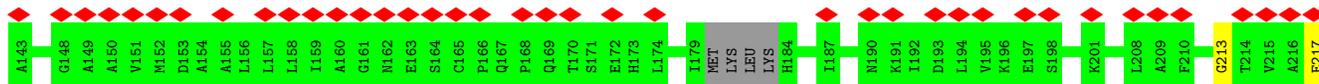
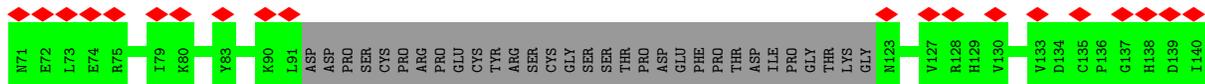
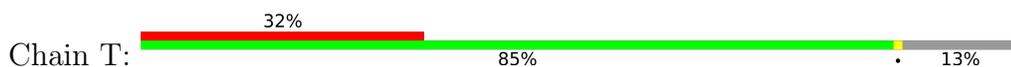

The following is a two-dimensional graphical depiction of Mogul quality analysis of bond lengths, bond angles, torsion angles, and ring geometry for all instances of the Ligand of Interest. In addition, ligands with molecular weight > 250 and outliers as shown on the validation Tables will also be included. For torsion angles, if less than 5% of the Mogul distribution of torsion angles is within 10 degrees of the torsion angle in question, then that torsion angle is considered an outlier. Any bond that is central to one or more torsion angles identified as an outlier by Mogul will be highlighted in the graph. For rings, the root-mean-square deviation (RMSD) between the ring in question and similar rings identified by Mogul is calculated over all ring torsion angles. If the average RMSD is greater than 60 degrees and the minimal RMSD between the ring in question and any Mogul-identified rings is also greater than 60 degrees, then that ring is considered an outlier. The outliers are highlighted in purple. The color gray indicates Mogul did not find sufficient equivalents in the CSD to analyse the geometry.

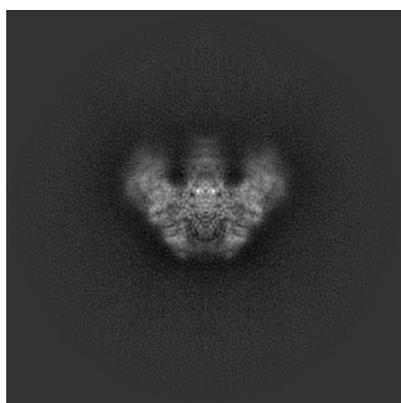

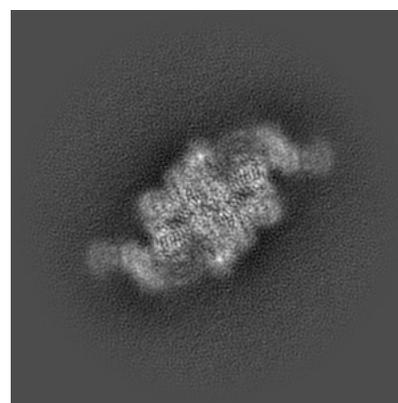

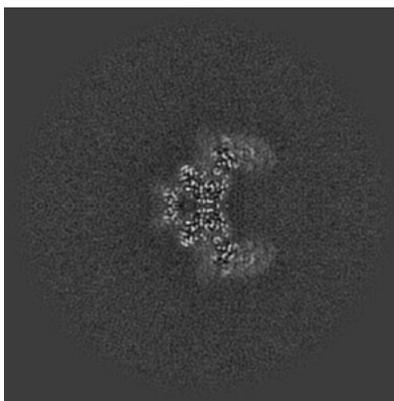
The images above show the map projected in three orthogonal directions.

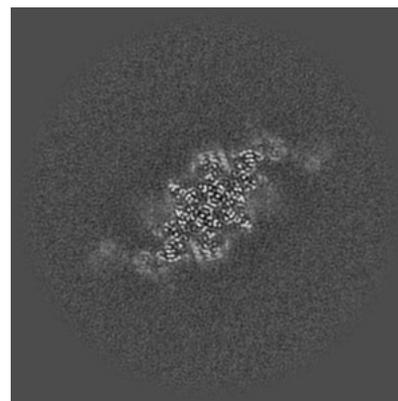

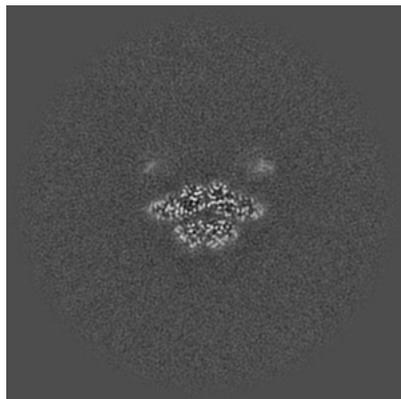

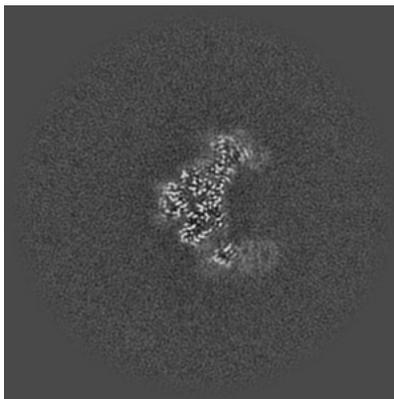
The images above show central slices of the map in three orthogonal directions.

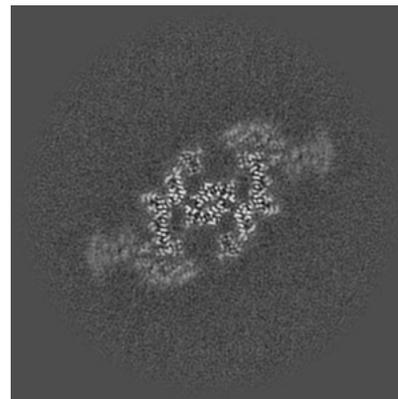

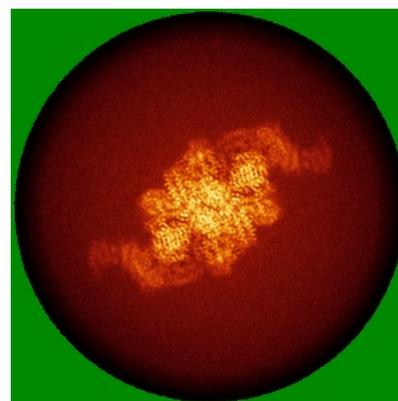

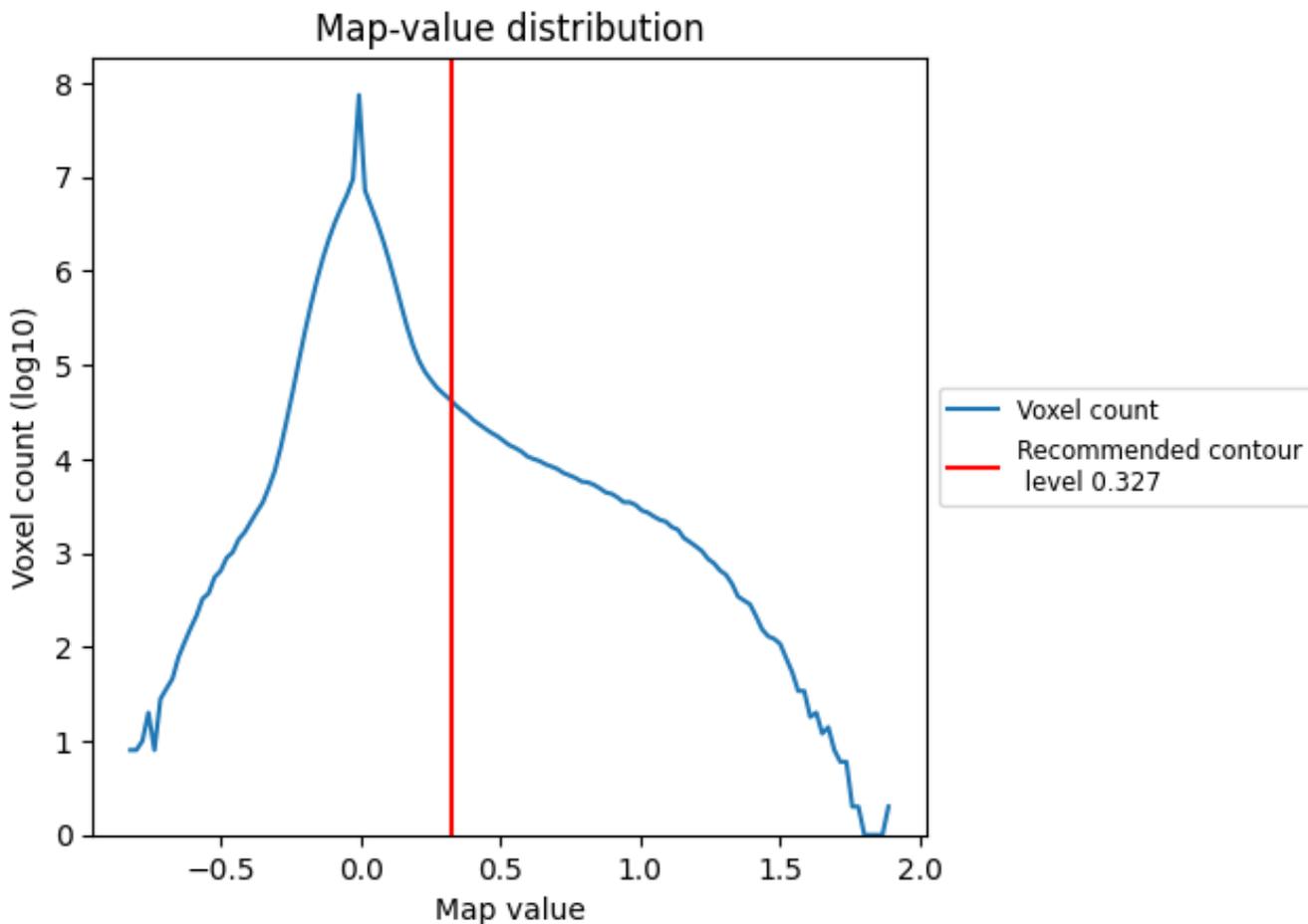

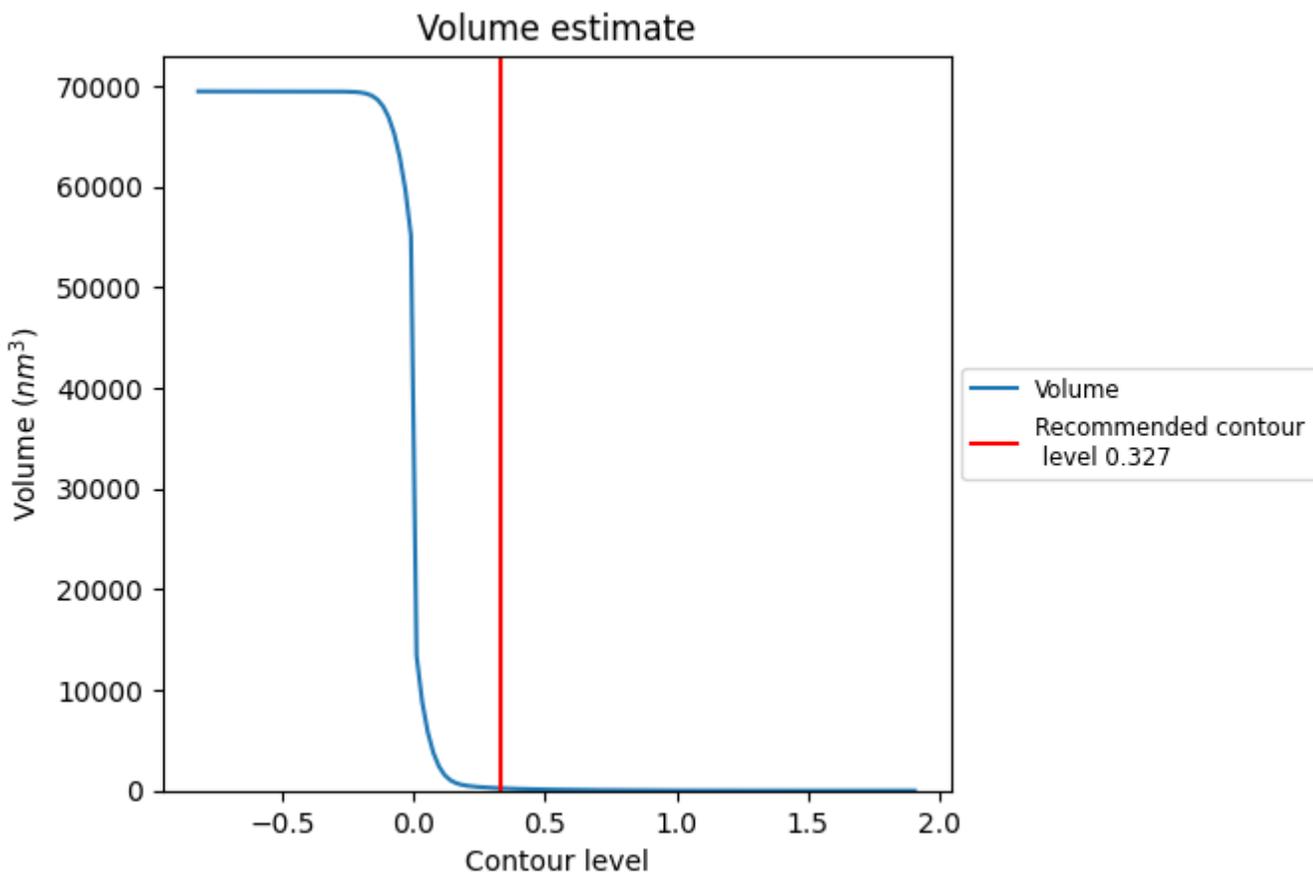

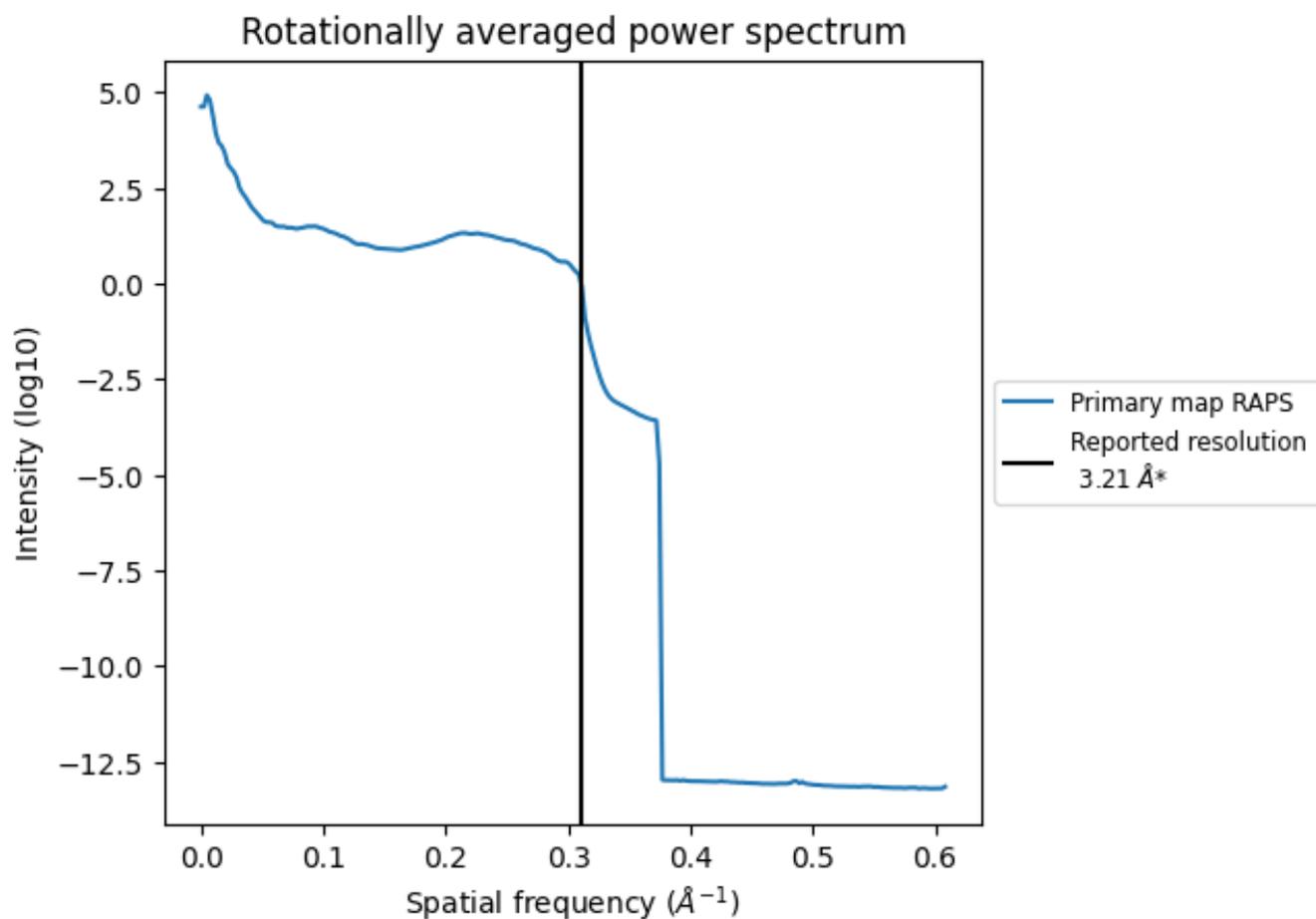
7.2 Volume estimate [\(i\)](#)



The volume at the recommended contour level is 240 nm³; this corresponds to an approximate mass of 217 kDa.

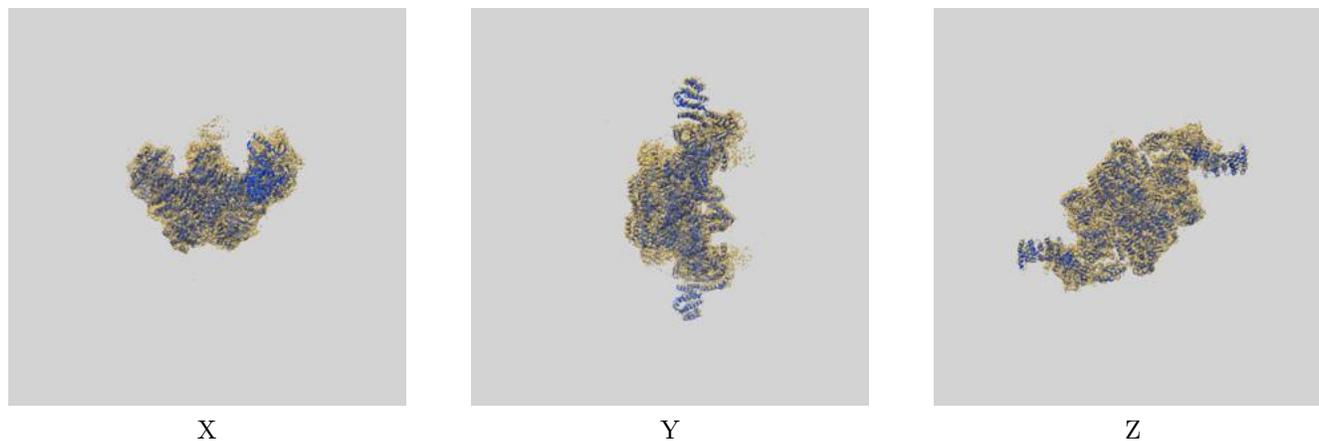

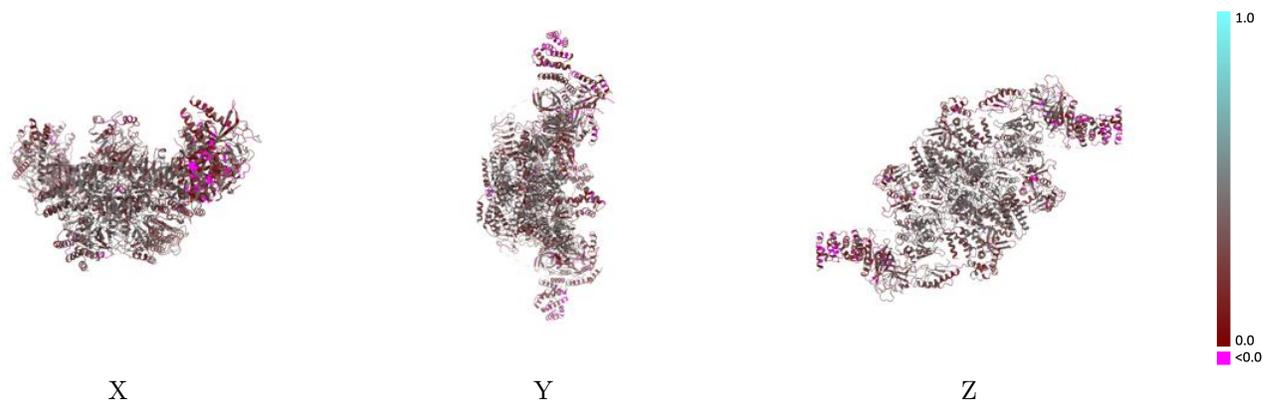

9.1 Map-model overlay [i](#)



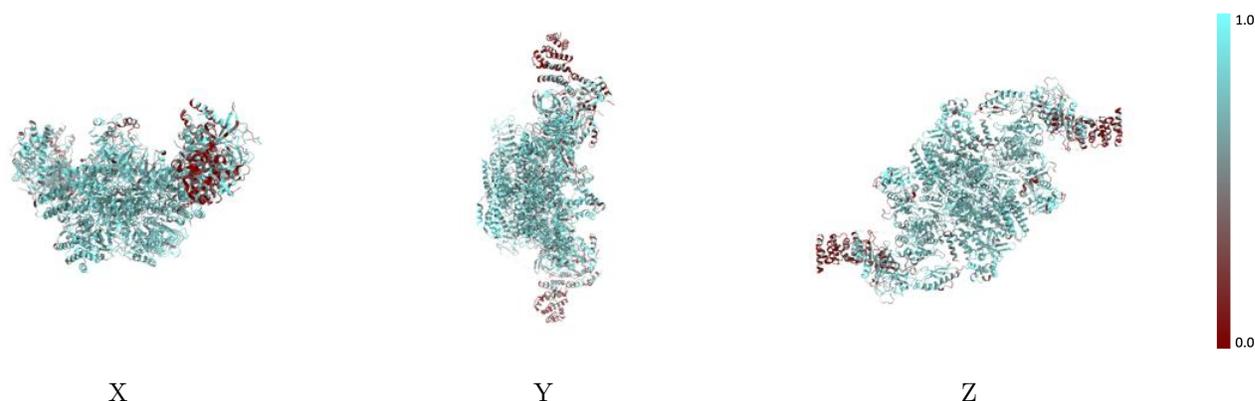
The images above show the 3D surface view of the map at the recommended contour level 0.327 at 50% transparency in yellow overlaid with a ribbon representation of the model coloured in blue. These images allow for the visual assessment of the quality of fit between the atomic model and the map.

9.2 Q-score mapped to coordinate model [i](#)



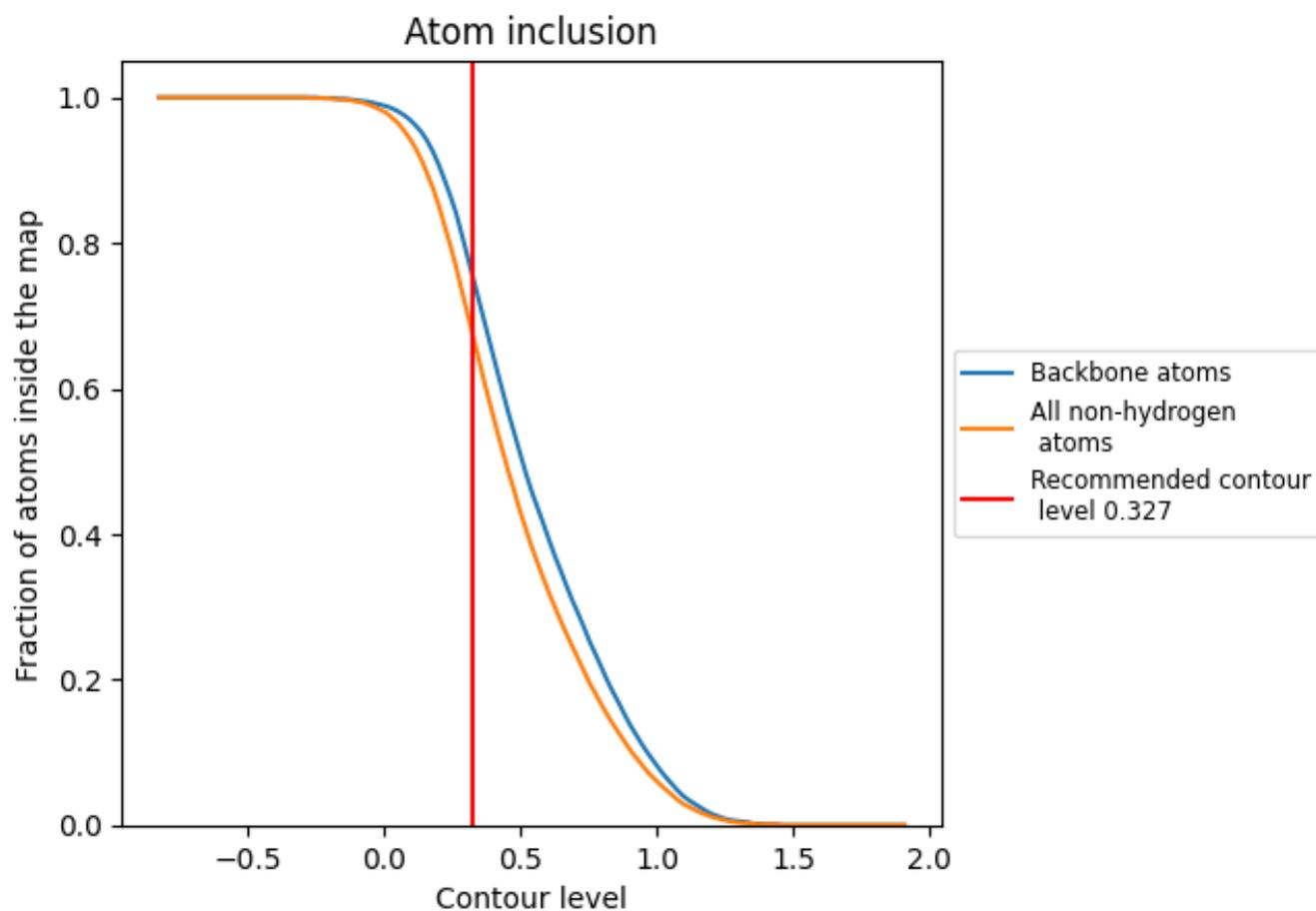
The images above show the model with each residue coloured according to its Q-score. This shows their resolvability in the map with higher Q-score values reflecting better resolvability. Please note: Q-score is calculating the resolvability of atoms, and thus high values are only expected at resolutions at which atoms can be resolved. Low Q-score values may therefore be expected for many entries.

The images above show the model with each residue coloured according to its atom inclusion. This shows to what extent they are inside the map at the recommended contour level (0.327).

9.4 Atom inclusion [i](#)



At the recommended contour level, 75% of all backbone atoms, 67% of all non-hydrogen atoms, are inside the map.
